

RESOLUTION 2015-033

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIERRA VISTA, COCHISE COUNTY, ARIZONA: AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO DONATE A 1999 FORD E350 WHEELED COACH AMBULANCE TO COCHISE COLLEGE; AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER, CITY CLERK, CITY ATTORNEY OR THEIR DULY AUTHORIZED OFFICERS AND AGENTS TO TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES AND INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Sierra Vista and Cochise College have an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) to teach fire science and EMT/Paramedic classes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sierra Vista has donated surplus vehicles and equipment in the past to help its neighbors, most notably in Sonora, Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the City has one surplus ambulance which it desires to donate to the Cochise College EMT/Paramedic program; and

WHEREAS, the students in the EMT/Paramedic program will benefit from obtaining this vehicle.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIERRA VISTA, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1

The policy of the City of Sierra Vista relating to the donation of surplus items to our IGA partners at Cochise College, when feasible and appropriate to do so, is hereby reaffirmed.


SECTION 2




