Written Salvage Plan

- Site perimeters shall be clearly delineated with survey markers or be apparent due to existing natural features such as washes or man-made features such as roads, fences, adjoining development, etc.
- City staff will identify plants requiring salvage from the site upon receipt of this application form.

- **Plant identification should typically occur toward the end of the site planning or subdivision platting review process.**
- **To avoid loss of plant identification markings, plants should be salvaged within 30 days of identification.**
- **City will notify applicant in writing of type and quantities of plants requiring salvage.**
- **Relocation of salvaged plants to an area of the property that will remain undisturbed is strongly encouraged.**

Please answer the following questions to the best of your ability. Attach a map, copy of the plat or site plan, showing the site boundaries and indicating (if a subdivision) whether any area will be set-aside as open space in lieu of salvaging native plants (minimum 15 percent of the site.)

Will salvaged plants be replanted on the site? If so, identify the approximate location on the enclosed map

If plants are to be taken from the site, where will they be stored or replanted? (Note: plants to be removed from the property must comply with applicable Arizona native plant law requirements)
